**Reflection & Discussion**

1. Peter emphasizes the importance of remembering the truth found in the Bible:
  - a. What Scriptures exhort believers to *know* truth and continually be reminded of it?
  - b. What sorts of blessings does God promise to those who proactively seek His truth?
  - c. What are the negative consequences of neglecting His truth?
  
2. False teachers—false doctrine—are prevalent in too many churches today: Have an open discussion on why/how this came to be.
  - a. Why do so many reject the idea of Jesus’ second coming followed by a 1000 year physical reign? Why do some churches insist that *supernatural creation* is an ‘open handed’ or ‘secondary’ topic? ...etc.
  - b. Uniformitarianism insists that *all things have been, and will be, as they are without divine intervention*. Why is this a dangerous doctrine? How would you refute it biblically?
  
3. How does believing in an imminent return of Jesus, followed by a literal earthly kingdom, shape the way you live today?
