Reflection & Discussion

(From last week):

1. False teachers—false doctrine—are prevalent in too many churches today: Have an open discussion on why/how this came to be.
 - a. Why do so many reject the idea of Jesus’ second coming followed by a 1000 year physical reign? Why do some churches insist that *supernatural creation* is an ‘open handed’ or ‘secondary’ topic? ...etc.
 - b. Uniformitarianism insists that *all things have been, and will be, as they are without divine intervention*. Why is this a dangerous doctrine? How would you refute it biblically?

2. Peter says these false teachers “deliberately overlook” God’s past judgments (v. 5). Read Romans 1:18–20
 - a. How does suppressing the truth lead people into deeper sin?
 - b. What biblical passages remind us to *know* God’s truth well? Which passages demand that we *live out* God’s truth?

3. Have an open discussion about God as the *creator* and *sustainer* of all things, who’s *will WILL be done!*
 - a. Does such knowledge enhance your prayer life? In what ways do these truths affect your manner of daily living? What are your favorite Bible passages that *magnify* God as being so uniquely powerful? ...etc.
