Interpreting Prophecy & Distinguishing Between Spirits

1 Corinthians 14:34 (ESV)

"the women should keep silent in the churches. For they are not permitted to speak, but should be in submission, as the Law also says."

1 Timothy 2:11-12 (ESV)

"Let a woman learn quietly with all submissiveness. (12)I do not permit a woman to teach or to exercise authority over a man; rather, she is to remain quiet." 1 Corinthians 14:29 (ESV)

"Let two or three prophets speak, and let the others weigh what is said."

Interpreting/evaluating prophetic words

- We don't naively/gullibly embrace every word as truth
- The solution to abuse isn't disuse, but wise correction
- They must be *inline* with Scripture and the teachings/traditions of the Apostles (<u>2 Thes.</u> <u>2:15</u>)
- They must edify, comfort, console, and encourage (1 Cor. 14:3)

1 Thessalonians 5:19–22 (ESV)

"Do not quench the Spirit. (20)Do not despise prophecies, (21)but test everything; hold fast what is good. (22)Abstain from every form of evil."

1 Corinthians 14:29 (ESV)

"Let two or three prophets speak, and let the others weigh what is said."

Interpreting/evaluating prophetic words

- If predictive, have they come to pass as prophesied?
- Are they delivered in love? (<u>1 Cor. 13</u>)
- Delivered in humility: is the speaker willing to be tested and receive correction?
